Bath Bouquet

Holly Rickert of Ulrich took a master bathroom that boasted plenty of room but a poor layout and transformed it into a well-designed, bright, and airy space for Woodcliff Lake homeowners. The room originally had an L-shaped vanity with two sinks, a tiny shower, a toilet stuck in the corner, and a huge tub. Her new configuration provided for separate his and her vanities, a separate water closet with linen storage, and a large, comfortable shower. To accommodate the separate vanities the homeowners dispensed with the tub, which was not a priority for them. The room's biggest attention-getter is a floral glass tile mural of red, green, yellow, and white — from Italian mosaic manufacturer Sicis — around the vanity. Sicis tile is used also as accents throughout the bath. The shower and back wall are covered in sparkling white tile, while the water closet, shower, and a niche for towels have a striped panel of white and five shades of green tile. The tile work warms up the clean lines of the blond wood cabinetry with white man-made stone countertops. The floor is green-blue porcelain tile.
